

MICHAEL HAHN, the new "Governor" of Louisiana, was duly initiated with imposing ceremonies on the 4th of this present month, and by his inauguration Louisiana at the present moment is subjected to a very remarkable amount of gubernation. First, there is General Banks, Governor General; then, General Shepley, Military Governor, whose appointment has never been revoked; then, Michael Hahn, who has just been "elected" civil Governor; and finally, there is Henry W. Allen, who signs himself "Governor of Louisiana," and who was regularly elected by a majority of the voters of the whole State. To add to the farcical character of affairs in the now "loyal" state of Louisiana, the State is still under martial law, and they have a new Attorney General, with no Legislature to make laws for him to interpret.
