He said he now has enough money to provide for all his needs, and he is not interested in gaining more wealth. He wants only to serve.

Noe was accompanied by his entire ticket. Gov. Long told the crowd his thought has always been, even while people thought him insane, to aid the people. He said he conducted "a long search for a gubernatorial candidate and finally came up with the best man, former Gov.


