He succeeded to the governorship as Heutenen governor as a

result of the impeachment of Governor Watmoth He also was elected to Congress in 1872 but did not take office as he at the time was waging a contest for a sent in the United States senate The contest, however, moved unsuccessful. He also had served as state senator, as delegate at large to many republican national conventions, and in several local offices in New Orleans He was owner and

publisher of The New Orleans Louisianian for 11 years During he civil war he was a captain in the Louisiana native guards. He was born in Macon, Ga Surviving him are a widow and two sons Burial will be in
