## Pinchback, Carpetbag Negro Governor, Buried The body of Pinckney Benton Stew-

art Pinchback, one-time negro lieutenant governor and acting governor of Louisiana for a short period during carpetbag days, who died in Washington, D. C., Wednesday, arrived in New Orleans at 12:45 Sunday and was taken immediately from the L and N. station to the private tomb of the

Pinchback family for burial. There was no funeral ceremonies. church services or ecclesiastical rites. and the burial was a private one, witnessed only by a few relatives and very close friends of the family.
