For over a year be has been kept a close prisoner at Richmond, and as late as Monday last, General Halleck assured his father that his son should be protected, as there was no ground for his exe-

ention, and it was therefore impossible -Notice was given at once by a flag of truce

that retaliation would follow such an act of brutality; but the assurance came too late, as the officer was executed on Friday last, three days before the interview.
