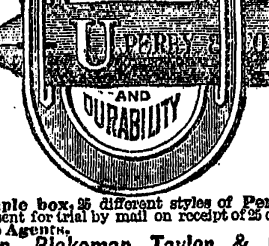
THE WILTZ FUND.
