

Wife to Share Monument Honoring Jefferson Davis

Sarah Knox Davis, first wife of the president of the Confederacy, will share the monument in his honor at Hollywood Cemetery, Richmond, Va., according to plans of the United Confederate Veterans. Mrs. Davis was buried in a cemetery near St. Francisville, La., but her bones will be removed to Virginia in the near future.

General K. M. Van Zandt, commander-in-chief of the veterans, has issued orders through Adjutant General A. B. Booth of New Orleans, appointing the following committee to obtain the removal of the remains:
