

*New Hampshire.*—John Brodhead, Thomas Chandler, Joseph Hammons, Henry Hubbard, and John W Weeks have been nominated by the Jackson party for reelection to Congress, and Joseph M. Harper instead of Jonathan Harvey.

*Vermont.*—At an antimasonic state convention, Herman Allen has been nominated for the office of Governor, Lebbeus Edgerton Lt. Governor, and Augustine Clark Treasurer. Ezra Butler, Josiah Rising, Martin Flint, William Slade, Augustine Clark, Alva Sabin, and Samuel C. Loveland were appointed delegates to the National Convention

*Pennsylvania.*—John Sergeant and Joseph R. Ingersoll are named by the Republican papers to represent the city of Philadelphia in the 22d Congress. Thomas H. Sill has declined a reelection to Congress.

*Ohio.*—Joseph S. Benham removed from the office of U. S. District Attorney, is a candidate for the 22d Congress, in opposition to James Findlay.

*Louisiana.*—Eleazar W. Ripley, late Brigadier-general in the U. S. Army, has offered himself for Congress. Mr. Ripley, who has long been supposed a public defaulter, has recently obtained a decision in his favor in a suit instituted by the U. States for the amount of the alleged defalcation.
