and on each angle thereof, within twined wreaths, the words 'Honor," "Valor,"
"Country," "D scipl ne," with a vignette extending around the border, according to a draft presented herewith; on the verse, the foregoing inscription in

Sec 3. And be at further engeted, That in addition to the sums already appropria-ted by law, for the purpose of furnishing stands of colors to the different battalions and regiments, the Governor is hereby
