Dusauz De la Croix and Duverger as members of the police jury for the 5th section of this parish, I hereby give notice to the inhabitants of said section, that according to law an election will be held on Saturday, the 17th of this month at the house of Mr. Peter Cazelard from 9 o'clock, A. M. till 3 o'clock P. M. to elect two persons to fill the place of the aforesaid Messrs. De la Croix and Duverger; the 5th section comprehends from Mr. Duverger's plantation inclusive to the lower boundary of the parish of Orleans, on the right bank of the river.

And in consequence of Mr. Charles Derbyigny's being a justice of the peace, there will be an election to fill his place in the parish jury for the 4th section, which comprehends from the lower boundary of Mr. Lucien Labrache's plantation on the right bank of the river to the plantation of Mr. Duverger in front of the city, at the house of Dominique Bouigny.

An Abominable Fraud, practised
by Tobacco, Planter's.

The inspectors of tobacco for this port, upon inspecting a lot of tobacco, on the 12th of last month, brought to this city by Messrs. Bruton and Simpson, and consigned to Messrs. Breedlove, Bradford & Robeson, found eleven hogheads with heads from four to seven inches thick, made of green oak timber; the staves from one and a half to two inches thick: on weighing the heading of one of the hogheads it was found to be 194 lbs. and the remaining eleven were of similar dimensions. Ten hds. of the above were marked C. S. and one R. S.; the planter's names are Charles Simmons and R. Simpson, residing in Sumner County, Tennessee.
